

1: Put the Jump Ring Tool (Tool) on the index finger of your non-dominant hand.



3: Fit your jump ring into the slots on the Tool until you find the slot that fits your ring best. You want a fit that is more snug than loose. If you use a slot that is too loose it will make opening & closing more difficult (not impossible, just harder). 2: Grab your jump ring with the Chain Nose Pliers (Pliers) so that the opening is at the top of the ring.





4: Line up the opening of the jump ring parallel to the side of the Tool. Make sure the opening isn't inside the Tool or covered by the Pliers. You want more than 1/3 of the jump ring inside the tool, but less than 1/2.



5: Keep your non-dominant hand stationary. Rotate the jump ring and Pliers towards the back of your non-dominant hand.



6: After adding or removing items from the jump ring, follow steps 2-4. Rotate the Pliers and jump ring towards the tip of your index finger to close the ring.



8: Ta-Da!



7: If you rotate too far and the ends of your jump

ring are not flush, rotate the opposite direction



As with all new skills, practice makes perfect.

With these steps you can change Surprise Module Pendants into charms for your bracelet or turn your charms into pendants. Later tutorials will teach how to hack charm modules into earrings and

earrings into charms or pendants.
